Report from meeting held on Monday 31 July 2017 at the Grenville Community Connections Hub

Sergeant Lesley gave the toast to the Queen, the people of Australia, and the invocation.

Chairperson P Alan called for spots.

P Alan has received confirmation from the Stretton Centre, Saint Patrick's Technical College, and the mayor of Playford for the District Governor's visit on the 21st of August. Elizabeth informed members that the club nominated three students to attend the National Youth Science Forum. One student withdrew and the other two were successful. Playford's student was unsuccessful, so District NYSF chair, Mike Stevens, suggested that Playford would sponsor one of the students which Elizabeth agreed to. She has given our student's contact details to Lesley so that he can comer and speak to us



After dinner Chairperson P Alan introduced our guest speaker Rosemary Stehbens from the Australian Kabuki Syndrome Association. She has been secretary of the Australian Kabuki Syndrome Association for the past eleven years. Before retiring in 2016 Rosemary worked as a registered midwife and nurse for thirty nine years.

The Australian Kabuki Syndrome Association is registered with Australian Charities Not for profit Commission, and is managed by volunteers, residing the breath of Australia, with the aim of bringing together persons with the rare genetic condition of Kabuki Syndrome and their family for social health,

networking, support through shared experiences, respite, friendship and above all to have some fun.

Kabuki syndrome is a rare genetic condition, occurring in approximately 1:32,000 live births. The condition displays typical facial features and a wide range of congenital abnormalities and problems. Two Japanese scientists identified and described condition in 1981. They called the condition Kabuki syndrome because the facial features of the individuals resembled the stage makeup used in Kabuki, a form of Japanese traditional theatre.

Jos Vergouwen, a Dutch parent of a child with the condition of Kabuki Syndrome, designed the logo which is now used throughout the world to represent Kabuki Syndrome. The character 'K' represents the world Kabuki and illustrates two outstretched arms symbolic of the invitation to network with one another.

In 2001 the first small group ever to meet in Australia, came together in Adelaide to share experiences and to support each other in the care of their child with the little known rare condition of Kabuki syndrome.

Another small get together in Adelaide in 2003 and third gathering in 2005 in Sydney, NSW followed. It was at the 2005 meeting that parents expressed their frustrated that there was very little information about the rare condition and not many medical, allied health personnel, school teachers or the general public knew of the condition. This made for parents always having to go to great lengths to explain their child's condition at all interviews. So a decision was made to form an Association to make an awareness of the rare condition and to have a point of contact for support.

In September 2006 the Association was officially formed holding the inaugural Annual General Meeting in Geelong, Victoria, preceding a National Family Day.

The Association meets annually, in a different State/Territory for a weekend. The children and young adults have organised healthy lifestyle activities while the parents, and some grandparents, attend an educational program on topics appropriate in the care and wellbeing for their child with the condition of Kabuki *Syndrome and siblings.*


The weekend commences with a lantern parade on the Friday night where the children, lost to the condition of Kabuki Syndrome and their family, are remembered and life celebrated. The Association raises funds to cover the cost of the accommodation, linen, catering and activities.
