P Alan informed members that we held a barbecue on Thursday April 19 for Anglicare at Burgate, he would like to thank the people who assisted in this. It was a great opportunity to put the club on display. For our efforts Anglicare will be making a donation. We had a display about Rotary and Alan observed a few people looking at the display.


We held the Group 4 dinner on the 9 April and this turned out to be quite a successful and enjoyable night. The upside was that everything we planned worked and it was a great opportunity to welcome Birgitta into the club as a member. The night was also successful in raising much needed funds for the Umoja Orphanage in Kenya. The funds for Umoja will be matched by an anonymous donor so our \$1000 will become \$2000!

After dinner Chairperson Elizabeth introduced our guest speaker for the night, Bazz Warren from Canoe 4 Kids. Bazz grew up in Elizabeth West as the son of alcoholics. He took a jockey apprenticeship and worked as a jockey for two years. He had a fall off a horse and he said that both the best and the worst thing anyone has ever said to him was, "Get back on the horse".

Bazz has raced motorbikes at Mallala where he was unbeaten in the wet and has five trophies. A life changing accident with serious injuries led him to decide to give to the community by raising funds for the Cancer Council, the Winter Blanket Appeal, meals for homeless, and his own project, "Canoe 4 Kids – Solar Power Challenge" which allow him to contribute where children have especial needs.

The first Canoe 4 Kids run occurred after Bazz bought a canoe from a man who

had canoed down the Amazon River. This run was from Mildura to Mannum. He stopped at a random beach about 156km past loch 8 due to his arms getting

tired and where he found a hard hat with his name on it which he took as a sign he was in the right place. He completed the last stretch from Loxton to Mannum with his cousin who joined him.

During December Bazz runs a separate fundraiser to give hampers to the homeless. He spent two hours n last year driving around the city feeding as many people as possible.

Sergeant Lesley handed out fines.

The raffle was drawn by Bazz and won by Craig.

P Alan thanked everyone for attending and closed the meeting. Elizabeth will be acting President whilst P Alan is away.

On Sunday April 29 the club enjoyed a visit to the National Trust SA Treasury Tunnels in the city. Just 3 years after settlement in South Australia, 1839, the early part of the building was constructed. Our tour was led by Dr. Jill McKenzie, a historian with a wealth of knowledge of our early heritage - her information kept us fascinated and members really enjoyed their visit.
