DG David Egan has been a Rotarian since 1985. In that time he has been a member of three clubs Largs Bay, Regency Park, and Adelaide and he is a past president of the latter two. He spoke about the need for change and the barriers and resistances to change that Rotary needs to overcome.

Resistance factors to change have included the annual leadership change and a past vs future paradigm. In the last ten years there have been too many districts. The membership of Rotary is also changing; the membership in Asia is rising and is falling in many developed countries.

PAG Rick Henke spoke about the history of Rotaract and how important the Salisbury City Rotaract Club is to the Rotary Club of Salisbury.

Rotaract is a system of clubs for 18 – 30 year olds and the first club was chartered in 1968 at the University of North Carolina. Rotaract had predecessors in many countries until they came together under a new type of club in Rotaract. Rotary International deliberately chose to create Rotaract rather than extend the age of Interact.

PAG Rick then offered a toast to the future of Rotaract.

P Damien then invited Salisbury City Rotaract Charter President Christopher Mark and 4 other members to speak on Rotary in the Future.

Prizes were given out by which colour of sticky note was in front of attendees.

P Damien Walker of the Salisbury City Rotaract Club then closed the meeting.

- ✚ On 29 October we will be having a Hat Night to raise money for Mental Health. Please wear a hat and bring a gold coin donation. We will have some fun things to do.

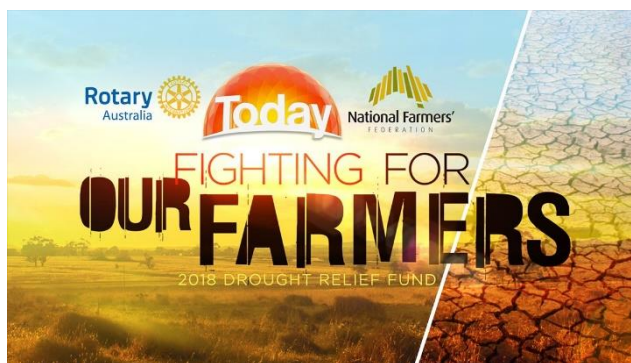
