After dinner Chairperson Gay introduced our guest speaker for the evening, Branden Craig, a teacher from St Patrick's Technical College to speak about their recent trip to Cambodia from 24 September to 4 October. Branden and John Neate took ten students including Jackson Bisset.

During their time in Cambodia this year the group helped fix up four classrooms. These classrooms had their brickwork rendered, and their thatch roofs replaced with iron roofing. As the students were doing this work the local children would come up and want to help and the St Patrick's students would teach them what to do so they could help.

The water pipes that a previous group from St Patrick's installed a couple of years ago is still working and this year's group made use of for getting water. The pipeline is a great example of St Patrick's projects at the Self Help Community being sustainable.

Next year St Patrick's are intending to provide the local workers with welding masks as they currently close their eyes whilst welding and they get it spot on every time.

Jackson Bisset was surprised by how happy the locals were and became very grateful for what he has after seeing how little many of the people had. He also found the language barrier tough. As time went by it got a bit easier as people got to know a few words in both English and Khmer.

Jackson is hoping to return to help the Self Help Community in a couple of years. He would also recommend the experience to other students.

The club made a donation towards St Patrick's Cambodia Trip next year.

P Elizabeth closed the meeting and thanked St Patrick's Technical College for hosting us.
