IPP Elizabeth in her opening of the meeting welcomed members – David Adamson and Delwyn Watts and family of Rotary, Jane Adamson.



training at Adelaide University and teachers' college in 1962, 63 and 64. He was sent to a rural school at Bookaby, past Ceduna, but when he arrived there, found out that he had been sent to open a new school at Siam, 150 miles west of Port Augusta. There were no books, desks etc. there. He lived in a caravan on an out station on Nonning Station. Geoff picked up school children as he drove to school. It was a great experience as children had not been to school before, they had done correspondence school.

Geoff was born in Wallaroo, then moved to Adelaide where he did his teacher

There was 12 volt power via a generator and wind light.

Bread was baked on Thursday morning and delivered on Saturday afternoon. Sheep were slaughtered on Saturday morning for the next week's meat. Social events were held at the station.

Teaching in a one teacher school had its advantages and disadvantages. The school opened with 14 children and grew to 24 over three years. The school council met once a month. Geoff bogged the car in a creek one night. It was pushed out by students, with a year seven student driving.

Years five and six students were taken on an excursion to Adelaide, via Wallaroo. They visited Light's Vision on Montefiore Hill, Rundle Street, where they rode up and down escalators and elevators. They visited Hamley Clark's gun shop. Hamley was in the shop and showed the children around.

In this time, Geoff did some unusual things; tanning kangaroo skins and making moccasins and cooking a snake on a dust pan.

In winter, they cooked Milo in a kettle on the fire. All students brought Milo, dried milk and sugar to school. In his third year at the school, Geoff moved to the main station. He worked with the station men on Saturday mornings. He built a hammer throwing ring so he could train. He threw a 16 pound hammer. Geoff and students painted the school.

Geoff then showed us some memorabilia from the area, including bullocks' shoes, a hame for a donkey's collar and an under yoke for bullocks.

P. George thanked everyone for their attendance and both he and Elizabeth closed their meetings.
