Report from meeting held on Monday 26 August 2019 at the Playford Civic Centre

P George Shaw opened meeting 1025 of the RC of Playford and called for spots. After his club's spots he closed their meeting.

Chairperson Elizabeth called for spots.

- PP Elizabeth and PP David attended Elizabeth South Primary School's assembly last week, where she was presented with a certificate by Pastoral Care Worker, Natalie Bubner, thanking us for our support of the school. She was also given a copy of the school' second kitchen garden cook book.
- David reminded members about the Northern Business Breakfast on Wednesday 28 August. The speaker is the Hon John Dawkins MLC who will speak about Building our economy and Securing our future.

After dinner Chairperson Elizabeth introduced our speaker for tonight, Natalie Bubner who is the Pastoral Care Worker at Elizabeth South Primary School and a Story Dogs Coordinator. She has previously worked as a veterinary nurse and social work with Lutheran Care. Natalie was also a RYLA awardee in 1979.

Natalie had five job interviews before being asked to apply for the position of Pastoral Care Worker at Elizabeth South Primary School. She took over two weeks before Easter and her job is to support the staff, students and parents. The parents were the biggest challenge.

When she trained as a Story Dogs Coordinator she did her training in Perth and became the coordinator for Adelaide. Story Dogs has chapters in every state and territory except the Northern Territory.

Story Dogs is a program where suitable volunteer and dog teams are trained to go into schools and listen to children read. Many children who are struggling with reading have an easier time reading to a dog than to an adult. These children are chosen by their teachers to be in the program. The children are generally in Year 2 with some from Years 3 - 5 with the aim being to keep the children in the program for a year although sometimes it is longer.

The program is about reading and confidence rather than accuracy. The dogs (some of whom fall asleep and snore at times) are from a wide range of breeds both large and small chosen for their temperament. The dogs are also usually owned by the volunteers themselves although they can sometimes be dogs that the volunteer has known well over a period of six to twelve months.

Schools with a Story Dogs program run a Story Dogs Day fundraiser each year of which there are 296 schools involved nationwide.

A Dog Team (volunteer and dog) can be sponsored for \$500 a year or \$1500 for three years. A sponsorship for two teams for two years for \$2000 is also available. See <u>http://www.storydogs.org.au</u> for more information.
