After dinner Chairperson George introduced our speaker for tonight, Aileen Eldridge from the Zonta Club of Para District Area. Aileen spoke about Zonta's history and programs. There are over thirty thousand members in one thousand two hundred clubs in sixty seven countries who are all determined to make a difference in both their local setting and globally.

Zonta's first club was chartered in Buffalo, New York on 8 November 1919 and therefore 2019 is their 100 year anniversary. The name Zonta is derived from a Lakota Sioux word meaning "honest and trustworthy". Zonta International envisions a world in which women's rights are recognised as human rights and every woman is able to reach her full potential. In such a world, women have access to all resources and are represented in decision making positions on an equal basis with men.

Since Zonta International was founded in 1919 Zontians have been passionate about empowering women in developing countries through international service. In the more than ninety years since its first international project was funded Zonta has contributed nearly \$US19.2 million to projects in thirty five countries. Through

funding from the Zonta International Foundation the Zonta International Service Program has provided training, education, health, sanitation, agricultural and micro-credit assistance to women, primarily through programs implemented by the agencies of the United Nations and other non-governmental organisations.

These international projects include the Zisvaw program: Ending violence against women and girls worldwide, Ending Child Marriage throughout the world and Eid Bi Eid (Hand in Hand)which is a multiyear initiative which began in 2015 to support the Jordanian government to address issues of employment and gender inequality exacerbated by the impact of the Syrian refugee crisis.

Zonta clubs choose projects in their own area which will improve the lives of women and girls. They may support them with goods or financially. Para District Area Club projects cover many areas and they are always interested in learning about new projects.
